Tulare County Office of Education Announces: 2005 *Excellence in Education Award* Winners To Be Honored Tomorrow Morning, October 12.

*Tulare County Administrator/Manager of the Year Tulare County Teacher of the Year

Nearly 400 friends, family members and colleagues will gather Wednesday morning, October 12, 2005, at the Visalia Convention Center, to honor the nominees, finalists and winners of the 2005 Tulare County Excellence in Education Awards. The program – now in its eleventh year – recognizes the Tulare County Administrator/Manager of the Year, Teacher of the Year, and School Employee of the Year. This year, a total of 37 nominees from 15 Tulare County school districts and the College of the Sequoias participated in competition, which was judged in May, 2005.

The highlight of the invitation-only breakfast event – which is co-hosted by the Educational Employees Credit Union – is a video presentation highlighting the three winners. The film features tributes by colleagues, students and parents, plus interviews with each winner. "The film is a great way to get to know the winners," says Tulare County Superintendent of Schools Jim Vidak.

A Porterville High School Biology and Life Science teacher, **Jeff Cozad is the 2005 Tulare County Teacher of the Year**. He has spent the last 33 years developing a large collection of animal species and wood carvings. He notes: “It is my hope that I have been the inspiration to my students that my teachers in high school were to me.”
